“Tulip blooming“ The Netherlands

2nd Day: Excursions wind mills and cheese / 49 € each person

In Zaanstad, visit the open-air museum and the 'Zaanse Schans', which reflects a typical village of the 17th and 18th century. You can visit a dairy, a cooperage, a wooden shoe workshop, a bakery Museum the Zaanse Clock Museum and the world's only “color mill”, de Kat, in addition to the souvenir shops. All other industrial windmill can be visited as well. After the open-air terrain, the Zaanse Museum, which offers an insight into the development of the “Zaanstreeks”, where the first industrial area is located. There, of course, you can buy products that are manufactured on the premises, mustard, cheese, pastries and so on. Then you can explore the city on your own. The city has many historical monuments. To name a few are some churches (for example, the Oosterkerk), the Town Hall, the municipal scales from 1609 and a city gate. You can visit several old houses, including a replica of the first shop of Albert Heijn (Dutch supermarket chain).

3rd Day: Excursion Keukenhof / 49 € each person

In the 15th century, the area where the Keukenhof is located was uncontaminated nature and property of Jacqueline of Bavaria. The estate has been used, except for hunting, to grow herbs for the kitchen of the Castle, which gave it its name “Keukenhof” (kitchen garden). Millions of Tulip bulbs varieties bloom today on approximately 32 acres of beautiful park, which is crisscrossed by 15 kilometres of walking trails. You can enjoy spectacular flower shows, inspirational gardens, unique works of art and great events. In addition, the Keukenhof Gardens are featuring 150 art pieces by 50 artists is the largest sculpture park in the Netherlands.

3rd Day: City and “Grachten“ Tour Amsterdam / 39 € each person

Amsterdam is quite small when compared to other cities of the world, but it has many advantages of a metropolis - historic and magnificent buildings and places of interest, famous museums and a pronounced nightlife. The ride takes you through the new and old districts, to the Koninklijk Paleis (Royal Palace), to the “Weeper's Tower” (retired and only preserved defence tower) to the wooden “Skinny Bridge” on the Amstel and the cathedral in the heart of the city. Afterwards you will see the most beautiful canals (from about 165 in total) and magnificent bridges (1,281 bridges in total and 80 just in the “Grachtengürtel”(canal section).

3rd Day: “Grachten“ Tour in the evening Amsterdam / 29 € each person

In the evening, Amsterdam offers fantastic views of the atmospherically lit city. See it for yourself! The network of navigable waterways of Amsterdam has a total length of over 80 kilometres. These include the “Herengracht”, the “Keizersgracht” and the “Prinsengracht”. The Amsterdam canals traverse the city in several rings and spanned by numerous bridges, just not an every day sight!

4th Day: Excursion Rotterdam and Delft / 49 € each person

The dynamic Harbour City of Rotterdam awaits with many attractions, such as for example the Town Hall, the Erasmus bridge (nicknamed “the Swan”), the “Kubuswoningen”(Cube house) and a prominent skyline. Then the tour will take you to the porcelain town of Delft, South Netherlands, which is known for the “Delft blue” (porcelain). The old town has numerous monuments that bear witness to its past as a thriving trading city in the golden age. Despite a severe town fire in the 16th century and a devastating explosion of the gun magazine in the 17th century, who spared only a few buildings, Delft has a well-preserved, coated by canals through historical cityscape that didn't lose the typical character of an old Dutch city.

5th Day: City Tour Arnhem / 19 € each person

Discover the historical City centre with the St. Eusebius church (also known as the Eusebiuskerk), the “Duivelshuis” (Devil's house), the “Sabelspoort” and the “Presickhaeffs Huys”. The city of Arnhem was heavily damaged by the battle for the bridge in the Second World War in September 1944 between the Allied forces and the German Wehrmacht. After the war, it was rebuilt and is still growing to this day. As the only city of the Netherlands, Arnhem has trolley buses, giving the city the nickname “Trolley”.
